SENPAI CORNER BY CHARLES

With all of the wildfires going on right now, there are lots of ashes in the air. These ashes settle on the leaves and needles of your trees causing distress. So, please take the time to occasionally rinse off the foliage of your trees. I know I keep talking about watering, but with the 100+ days, a little wind and the falling ashes could be potential trouble for your trees. It is strange, that we struggle to keep the right balance of moisture for our trees, and yet, that oxalis seems to thrive and spread – which is my way of saying to also keep your eye out for unwanted weeds.

TIDBITS BY BEA

In my continued quest to find natural ways to keep plants healthy, I came across an article on the benefit of **Listerine**...yes, you are reading right! Listerine mouthwash has many other uses around the garden and here are a few of them:

- It has strong <u>anti-fungal properties</u>. It can be used to get rid of powdery mildew and other fungal infections. Mix 75% of water and 25% of mouthwash to make a working solution and spray it on the infected parts.

Just add water and mouthwash in equal proportion and spray it on the plants suffering from aphid infestations. You can also add a similar amount of mild liquid dish soap to make this recipe even stronger.

- 4. You can also use Listerine to <u>disinfect garden tools</u>. Simply soak them for one minute or spay full strength Listerine on your smaller garden tools to disinfect them to prevent disease.
