Hello everyone. March is an exciting time. This is when your trees wake up and the buds swell and the first couple of leaves appear. We will need to keep on top of our pruning and keeping our trees shape maintained. And keep a close eye on any branches that you have wired, because with the dramatics growth your trees are going through, there is the risk that the branch will swell past the wire and cause that dreaded spiral scar. Continue to monitor your moisture levels and watch for sneaky overnight frosts and if you have not already started, begin fertilizing your trees.
