This is a fun and simple technique can produce amazing results in a short time. Also, after the demo, if you need help repotting or working on your tree, feel free to bring it as well and myself or one of the club mentors will be happy to assist.

SENPAI CORNER

Spring is a wonderful time of year for me. The trees start to wake up, the flowers bloom and you realize, that one bonsai that lost its leaves early last fall and appeared dead all winter you really didn't kill after all. We are now in our busy time, with pruning, repotting styling cleaning and wiring. Stay vigilant with any previous wiring and watch closely for branch swelling so you do not permanently damage the tree. If in doubt, cut the wire off and re-wire. Also, if you have not already started, you should be fertilizing frequently and may need to step up watering frequency, now that we cannot rely on the rains to help us out. Our show is in June so start thinking of what trees you want to display and please provide a list in April or May, so I can make sure that I have labels printed.
