SENPAI CORNER

If the pH of the soil is outside of the bonsai's ideal pH range, the tree may lack vigor or in other cases, the tree can begin to suffer ill health. Below is a general guideline for a variety of species: you can use commonly available soil amendments or chemical additives to adjust the soil pH as needed.

A pH of 5.0-6.5 is regarded as acidic, a pH of 6.5-7.5 is regarded as being neutral, a pH of over 7.5 is regarded as alkali.


TIDBITS
