MARCH MEETING

Our March meeting was about Saikei or landscape planting. We started out

with a tray or shallow dish. Then we arranged rocks of the same type and coloration, making sure they were of different sizes and visually interesting. Then we trimmed and styled a couple of small junipers. Always remember to use an odd number of trees, unless you are creating a forest type of planting or once you are over about seven trees. After placing the trees, we filled the rest of the tray with soil, added mosses and ground covers, a small line of rocks to suggest a pathway or stream, and then the planting was complete.

The April meeting, we will discuss group or forest plantings. So bring your trays, lots of seedlings or trees and follow along. As usual, if you have another tree that you want to work on, need help with or just show off, please feel free to bring it along.

SENPAI CORNER

Wiring is an important tool in our collection of ways to train our bonsai!

When wiring, select a gauge that is appropriate to the branch that you want to bend. If the wire is not strong enough to hold the bend, it is perfectly acceptable to place another wire alongside of the first wire. Just make sure that you do not cross over the first wire as that will put a lot of pressure in one small area and cause the branch there to swell.

When wrapping the branch, try to keep an even pressure and an even spacing as you move out to the end of the branch. Also, always anchor the wire either to another branch or the trunk or even by pushing it down into the soil if you are wiring the trunk.

After a couple of months, check the tree for swelling in the area of your wiring. Missing this step can cause severe scaring, which may take years, if ever, to go away. If in doubt, cut the wire off and check the branch position.

Remember, we use wire to move a branch to a new position. Once it has been train to grow in the new position, there is no longer a need to keep the wire on the branch.

Our show is in June so start thinking of what trees you want to display and please provide a list in April or May, so I can make sure that I have labels printed.
