So, with raffia and wire, we repositioned the trunk to a more appealing shape. The remainder of the meeting was a general workshop and repotting of some small olive trees in preparation for our June show.

SENPAI CORNER BY CHARLES

With Spring comes new growth, flowers and a lot of excitement with our trees – but it also brings weeds and pests. Keep an eye out for those little buggers. They can take the form of spider mites, who love to snack on your junipers, aphids, scales or lord only knows what. All with the same purpose, munching on your trees!

Please take the precaution of spraying with either an organic pesticide, or the nuclear option of chemicals – but do try to prevent them from taking over. Also, if you remember, in a previous newsletter I discussed oxalis, and other invasive weeds, the best solution for those, is just to physically remove them - and attempt to get all the roots. Only by staying ahead of these interlopers, will you keep you plants healthy. Additionally, with diligent fertilizing, you will also provide your tree with the strength it needs to fend off most diseases that it might come in contact with. See you soon and let's plan for a great come back show in June.

TIDBITS BY BEA

To piggyback on Charles warning about pests on your trees, I always lean towards natural ways instead of using chemicals and things that you may have around the house such as "Listerine Mouthwash". Yes, you read it right. You can spray the undiluted mouthwash directly on the infected parts of orchids suffering from bacterial infections and crown rot. Mouthwash has strong anti-fungal properties. It can be used to get rid of powdery mildew and other fungal infections. For this, mix 75% of water and 25% of mouthwash and spray on the infected parts.

For aphids' control, use water and mouthwash in equal proportion and spray on the plant. You can also add a similar amount of mild liquid dish soap to make this recipe even stronger.

Let's not forget to disinfect tools as you can easily spread a disease from one tree to another thru the use of your tools. Here again, Listerine to the rescue – simply soak your tools for one minute or spray full strength Listerine on your tools.

Finally, I would like to share a picture that one of our members, Alan Mode, sent me. Alan is our Bougainvillea Bonsai expert as this picture clearly illustrate.
