MARCH MEETING BY CHARLES

At the March meeting, we talked about how to prepare for the upcoming show, emphasizing the need for spraying for pests. We will be looking for no more that 2 or 3 trees per member as last year got a little out of hand with a large amount of trees. Also, we will no longer accept trees the morning of the show. All trees will need to be in the day before (Friday). Just a reminder that Alden Lane closes at 5:00. If that is an issue, please check with Charles to make alternative plans. Charles will be accepting trees after 3:00 on Friday, so that he has enough time to set up the room prior to the trees arriving. We also spent some time discussing wiring; the need for clean /even wiring, the need for anchoring the wiring and sometime using some other structure. We also talked about even spacing and how to determine the types and sizes of wire to use. The remainder of the meeting was a general workshop.



TIDBITS BY BEA

I would like to share with you some sources to get nice Bonsai at a decent price.

First, Brussel's Bonsai. (https://brusselsbonsai.com) I know a couple of our members have ordered from this site and have been very satisfied. I recently ordered a Ginseng grafted Ficus – shown below.



Now, for those who wonder if what I received matches the picture on their site, well here it is. Pretty close to the picture and the packaging was unbelievably good. This little guy arrived just in a few days in perfect condition. The soil was moist and no damage to the foliage. It was smothered in packing peanut. I am very happy with what I received. Their price range is from reasonable to expensive, but I think it is worth a look.



The second site that I recently came across is Lucky Bonsai Limited (https://lucky-bonsai.com/). Unlike Brussel's Bonsai where you can purchase a mature Bonsai, and though they do sell mature Bonsai, this site seems to be set up for starters. Their mature Bonsai are a little pricey. They also sell pots at what seems to be reasonable price and tools.

And of course, we also recommend Stone Lantern (https://stonelantern.com/) That is the to go site for tools at a very reasonable price, wire, pots and books.
