MARCH MEETING BY CHIP


At our March meeting, we talked about the importance of clean and even wiring techniques, as well as the importance of cleaning our pots and having our trees presentable – especially for our upcoming show.

It is the time of year when I am anxiously awaiting my Zelkova to finally leaf out. I can see the little green buds have formed, but every day I wander over and peer hopefully at the branches to see them swell a little bit more, and I have to remind myself that each of our plants grows at its own pace. I saw an article that the cherry blossoms in DC are in full bloom, but in Japan, they are running a little behind. So, each of our trees tend to progress at the pace they wish. We need to remember not to push our trees into a shape, pattern or growth they are not ready or willing to conform to. Like I have said, if the tree naturally grows in an upright shape, then trying to bend it into a twisted or contorted shape, albeit may look interesting, there will always be a tension when viewing your tree. So, let your tree grow to its form and allow its leaves to swell and grow at the pace it wants, it is an amazing individual, just like us.
