# 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Valley Bonsai Society Show June 19<sup>th</sup> & 20<sup>th</sup> at Alden Lane

On the weekend of June 19<sup>th</sup> & 20<sup>th</sup> from 10:00 – 4:00pm the Valley Bonsai Society will hold its 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Bonsai Show at Alden Lane Nursery as part of an upcoming "Black & Blues" Event they are holding. Last year's show far exceeded our expectations and we are out to do it again. We are again planning 2 demonstrations again this year. We will be welcoming back Sam Adina for a workshop. Right now we are expecting our own Charles 'Chip' Harder to do the other workshop. We will again be raffling off the demonstration trees with proceeds going to the club treasury. In addition this year we will want to have different people working on their tree's out front to stimulate interest. If you are interested in helping with this Charles will be taking sign-ups for 1 or 2 hour segments. Last year quite a few people left the show and went to the Bonsai section of Alden Lane to get started. Since it is also Father's day weekend, it is a great way to stimulate interest by encouraging a Bonsai Father's day gift.

As a club, we pride ourselves in being open to Bonsaists of all levels of interest, experience and ability. We want our show to reflect that and have trees from those who have been at it for decades, those who are just getting started and anyone in between. So don't worry if you think your tree's aren't good enough, they are. Don't worry if you just styled it and got it in a pot. We need those as well.

Let's see if we can exceed last year's success and encourage people to give Bonsai a try!

### **Getting Ready For The Show**

We will again have door prizes. Thank you to those of you who took home the donated plants to work on them for this. Don't forget to bring them in. If anyone else that wishes to donate trees, starters, books, pots etc to the door prize pile, it would be appreciated and make for more excitement for the attendees.

Charles needs a list of plants and a count (# of trees) so we can plan the tables - that you think you might want to show - even if you do not end up bringing a particular plant, I would rather have a label printed out and space available, and not need it, than trying to print something and squeeze in space during the show. The information needed is below. Ideally this information is needed this week (by June 4th) to allow proper planning.

#### **Getting Ready For The Show (cont'd)**

- Clean up your pots a scroungie and some light soapy water will clean them up. A light rub with mineral oil
  will restore a sheen to them if they are looking a bit tired.
- Look for mats or stands to display them on. Dollar Tree, etc often has very inexpensive reed place mats.
   Cutting up wood strips into varying lengths provides a nice display base. Stands that fit your pots are always good. Try to maintain a reasonable proportion of the display to the tree. But don't worry if you can't find anything or aren't sure. We will have some extras and will make adjustments as we set up.
- Charles will be at Alden Lane around 2:00 3:00 on the Friday before the show, so if you want to bring your trees by then, we can start setting up a little early.
- If you have some tree's but can't attend the show, let Charles know so arrangements can be made to get your tree and care for them until your return.
- No Tree? how about grabbing a juniper and style that. Most of us started on junipers anyway. Starter tree's are always welcome.

#### **Volunteers Needed**

We also need volunteers to be at the show to answer questions, keep little fingers out of the pots and keep pots from "walking away", etc. I would like people to come for a minimum of 2 hours
