SENPAI CORNER

The sun is lower in the sky this time of year, so to avoid most of the growth being on one side of your tree, remember to rotate your trees exposing all sides evenly. Also, since it appears that we are starting to get some rain, watch the moisture levels in your pots, either not enough water in your pot or pooling, which can be helped with a small block of wood under one edge. As the leaves fall from your trees, this is a great time to study the future of your trees and decide which branches you want to keep and which ones you want to eliminate.
