SENPAI CORNER BY CHARLES

December and January are slow months for our trees. It is probably a good thing with the end of the year and holidays distracting us, and occupying our attention in other areas.

There are a few things that can be done if you are inclined (or desperate) to work on a tree:

- Maples and other deciduous trees can benefit from some light pruning after the leaves drop. I would avoid flowering/fruit tree trimming, unless you are not concerned with getting flowers or fruit next season. Focus on balancing the tree, reduce strong growing branches, and leave the weaker ones to develop. These can be pruned later once they are stronger.
- Junipers are another candidate for getting some minor pruning. Keep in mind that any wiring that is done will not really be effective until next spring, since the branches are likely already hardened off for winter dormancy.
