This is a great time to consider repotting before we head into fall and winter. By repotting at this time, we are taking advantage of the several warm days we will see this month; this allows time for the trees to settle into their pots before winter. Then when spring arrives, the tree will spend its energy with growing, instead of splitting it between growing and settling into its pot. I would also recommend shifting to a high nitrogen fertilizer for these last couple of weeks before we stop fertilizing for the winter.
